



Session Twenty-Eight: Faith Follows God

Today's Point:

Faith means trusting God, even when we can't see what He's doing.

Bible Passage:

Hebrews 11

(This chapter tells about people who had great faith in God and obeyed Him.)

Today's Bible Skill:

- Learn that Hebrews is in the New Testament
- Learn that Hebrews 11 is the Faith Chapter
- Discover what it means to live by faith

Kid-Friendly Faith Definition:

Faith is trusting God to do what He says—even when we don't see it yet.

Bible Truth Activity:

Game: "Faith Walk"

Object of the game: Teach kids to follow and trust, even without seeing everything clearly.

Materials:

- Blindfold
- Obstacles or cones to walk around
- A leader to guide

Directions:

1. Blindfold one child while another child gently gives directions.
2. Have the blindfolded child walk a short path following only their partner's voice.
3. Switch roles after each turn.

Say:

Hebrews 11 is full of people who couldn't always see what God was doing, but they trusted Him anyway. That's what faith is—believing God and following Him, even when it's hard or uncertain.

Bible Discovery Discussion:

Ask the kids:

- What does it mean to have faith?
- Who are some people in the Bible who had faith?
- Can kids have faith too?

Say:

Hebrews 11 tells us about people like Noah, Abraham, and Moses—who believed what God said and obeyed. They didn't know exactly how things would turn out, but they trusted God because He always keeps His promises. We can trust Him too!

Bible Verse Activity – Faith Verse Echo**Focus Verse:**

Hebrews 11:1 (CSB)

“Now faith is the reality of what is hoped for, the proof of what is not seen.”

Hebrews 11:1 (KJV)

“Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.”

Instructions:

1. Say each part of the verse and let kids echo it.
2. Add simple hand motions:
 - “Faith” – Point to your heart
 - “Hoped for” – Point ahead like you're looking forward
 - “Not seen” – Cover your eyes and smile

Repeat a few times, then challenge them to say it all together without help.

Say: Faith isn't about seeing—it's about trusting God because we know He is good and keeps His word.

Bible Skills Activity: “Heroes of Faith Hunt”

Materials:

- Cards with the names and symbols of people from Hebrews 11 (e.g., Noah – Ark, Abraham – Stars, Moses – Basket, etc.)
- Hide the cards around the room

Instructions:

1. Let kids search for the “faith heroes” around the room.
2. When a card is found, read who it is and what they did by faith.
3. As a group, repeat: “By faith, [Name] trusted God!”

Say:

These people are remembered because of their faith! And guess what? God wants us to be people of faith too—who trust Him every day.

Craft Activity: “Faith Footsteps”

Materials:

- Paper footprints
- Markers or crayons
- Glue or tape

Instructions:

1. Have each child write or draw one way they can show faith in God.
2. Tape the footprints in a “faith path” on the wall or floor.
3. Walk the path together, reading each step aloud.

Say:

Faith takes steps—even small ones. Every time we choose to trust God, it's like taking another step of faith!
