WHAT IS A PATH GROUP?

A PATH group is a way for men to gather in smaller groups for growth, encouragement, and accountability. The ideal place to look for putting together a PATH Group is in your Connect Group, where you already have relationships and patterns that put you and your families in close proximity to one another.

In your PATH group, agree on a time, setting, and course of growth that works for your members. A great place to start is planning weekly or bi-weekly meetings and discussing the First Baptist Hendersonville Bible Reading Plan. Using the 4 Questions below, you can have powerful discussions that push you as a group toward growth in Christ.

GUIDELINES FOR A PATH GROUP

- Find a time that works for your group.
- Make your plan sustainable. (Bible Reading Discussion, One chapter per meeting book discussion.)
- Focus on relationship, support, and obedience.
- Keep it small. (4-6 men)

RULES OF ENGAGEMENT

- We're here to grow and be challenged.
- Confidentiality is a non-negotiable.
- Make the group a priority.
- Keep it encouraging.

1. *What have you learned from the Word this week?*
2. *Have you spent significant time in prayer for self and others?*
3. *Who are you seeking to share Christ with?*
4. *What is God telling you to do this week?*
