



Session Thirty: God Kept His Promise

Today's Point:

God always keeps His promises.

Key Passage: The Birth of Jesus- Luke 2:1-7

Bible Verse: Luke 2:6-7

CSB: “While they were there, the time came for her to give birth. Then she gave birth to her firstborn son...” Luke 2:6-7

KJV: “And so it was, that, while they were there, the days were accomplished that she should be delivered.” Luke 2:6-7

Today's Bible Skill:

- Continue memorizing Luke 2:6-7
- Practice listening to Bible stories carefully
- Understand that Jesus' birth was part of God's plan

Bible Truth Activity:

Game: Journey to Bethlehem

Object of the game:

Kids will remember that Mary and Joseph traveled to Bethlehem.

Materials:

- Tape or paper markers to create a path
- Backpack or small bag

Directions:

Create a winding path around the room. Children take turns walking the “road to Bethlehem” while carrying the bag.

Along the path, stop and ask simple review questions:

- Who traveled to Bethlehem?
- Who was born there?
- Where was Jesus laid?

After everyone finishes say:

Mary and Joseph had a long trip to Bethlehem, but God had a special plan.

Long before Jesus was born, God promised to send a Savior. Jesus' birth showed that God always keeps His promises.

Ask:

- Have you ever had to wait for something special?
- Why can we trust God's promises?

(Allow responses.)

Say:

God always does what He says He will do.

Bible Verse Activity – Lantern Pass

Materials:

- Battery-operated candle or flashlight

Instructions:

Dim the lights slightly if possible.

Pass the light carefully around the circle.

Each child says one word or phrase of the verse before passing the light to the next child.

Continue until the whole verse is completed.

Repeat several times.

Explain that Jesus came to bring hope and light to the world.

Bible Skills Activity: Christmas Story Search

Materials:

- Bible for each child

Instructions:

Help children locate:

- Luke 2
- Matthew 2

Explain that both books tell parts of the Christmas story.

Practice finding:

- Luke 2:1
- Luke 2:7

Allow children to help one another.

Conclude by saying:

God gave us the Bible so we can learn about Jesus and trust His promises.
